- become part of a statewide network of exceptional educators for continued support and learning.



Participant Requirements for all Institutes

WHO'S ELIGIBLE: Educators (K–12) currently teaching science in North Carolina, or administrators, environmental educators and university professors who work with these teachers.


QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants should demonstrate an interest in the natural sciences and be willing to use and support innovative teaching methods in the classroom and on field trips. Applicants should have at least three years of teaching/supervising experience and expect to continue working in or with North Carolina schools during the 2017–2018 school year. All participants should be prepared for moderately strenuous activity.

REQUIREMENTS: Participants in the Institutes will be asked to recruit a year-round class or other educational group to share their adventure online. Prior to the field experience, each participant will describe the upcoming Institute to his or her group. Students will follow along online in near real time with participants.

After the trip, all participants must develop an educational project incorporating their experience from the Institute. Project proposals are due approximately two months after the field experience. Participants are encouraged to share their projects at meetings or conferences of professional organizations such as the N.C. Science Teachers Association and at Museum events.

SELECTION: The Museum strives to achieve statewide representation from diverse backgrounds and a range of grade levels. Preference is given to educators who show evidence of community and institutional support, flexibility, and a tendency to be active group participants.





CREDIT: All Museum workshops may be approved for renewal credits by local school districts. Participants receive a certificate of course completion for the number of instructional hours. Institute participation can be used to meet eligibility criteria for the N.C. Environmental Education Certification Program. 

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Yellowstone National Park Institute

DATES: June 17–25, 2017 (Mandatory pre- and post-trip sessions will be held in Raleigh on April 22 and November 4, 2017.)

LOCATIONS: Yellowstone National Park, Montana and Wyoming; and Raleigh, N.C.


PARTICIPANTS: Limited to 12

ACTIVITY LEVEL: Moderate to rigorous including walking/ hiking at high altitude.

COST: \$950 (includes supplies, round-trip air travel between Raleigh and Bozeman, Montana, all ground transportation, instruction, lodging). Participants will be responsible for travel to and from Raleigh, expenses in Raleigh during preand post-trip sessions, personal expenses and meals in Yellowstone. Many participants receive financial support from their schools and/or local civic or professional organizations.

SAMPLE ACTIVITIES: Participating educators will study and experience the wonders of the world's first national park. Join us from sunrise to sunset as we observe the incredible wildlife including bears, bison, wolves and elk. Learn about the area's unique geothermal features and enjoy the magnificent scenery as we hike trails throughout the park. The daily program will include field experiences, opportunities to meet with park staff to discuss resource management issues, and instruction in integrating their experiences into the classroom. Discover strategies for exploring the connections between Yellowstone and North Carolina (wolf and elk reintroduction, fire ecology, resource management issues in the parks, and much more).

DATES: July 25-August 1, 2017 (Mandatory pre- and post-trip sessions will be held in Raleigh on May 6 and November 4, 2017.)

LOCATIONS: Belize, Central America, and Raleigh, N.C.

PARTICIPANTS: Limited to 12 (Note: Belizean teachers will join with American educators to form an international team that shares teaching techniques.)

ACTIVITY LEVEL: Moderate to rigorous including walking/ hiking in tropical (high heat/humidity) settings, canoeing, and snorkeling.

COST: \$1,300 (includes supplies, round-trip airfare from Raleigh to Belize, instruction, lodging, and meals). Participants will be responsible for travel to and from the North Carolina airport, expenses in Raleigh during pre- and post-trip sessions, and personal expenses. Many participants receive financial support from their schools and/or local civic or professional organizations.

SAMPLE ACTIVITIES: Participants will experience several tropical habitats, including coral reefs, mangrove swamps, and rain forests. The daily program will include practical field experiences, basic biological information, and easily duplicated techniques for teaching natural sciences. During the trip, participants will provide daily updates to students in North Carolina via the Internet. This program is designed to give educators a direct experience with environments and concepts that are part of the classroom curriculum. Participants will spend time at a Belizean school interacting with teachers and students.
