# What is a Nature Neighborhood Garden?

Nature neighborhoods are areas such as residential backyards, school grounds, or environmental education centers that are enhanced to attract wildlife and to provide for their needs. Our garden serves as an outdoor teaching site, as a demonstration and learning area for homeowners, and as a research laboratory where we can experiment and demonstrate ways to raise native plants, attract wildlife, and provide enjoyment and learning for people.

This garden is a place for wildlife and learning, made up of sun-loving NC native plants attractive to both wildlife and humans. The garden also has a water-harvesting, green-roofed pavilion, a dry streambed that directs runoff to a rain garden, two small bog gardens, and an above-ground pond.

# How can I visit the garden?

Prairie Ridge Ecostation shares this garden with teachers, homeowners, and children of all ages. We invite you to visit the Nature Neighborhood Garden Monday-Saturday 9:00-4:30 or Sunday 12:00-4:30 throughout the year.

It is a magical and peaceful place to visit and enjoy three seasons of flowers along with myriad colorful insects and birds.
