Galileo Galilei: 1564 - 1642

Italian Astronomer, Physicist, and Engineer


**1609** - Galile• learns about the telescope and creates his •wn version, the refracting telescope. His discovers the moon is not a smooth surface, as •nce believed, but has craters and ridges.

**1610** - Galile• •bserves the phases •f Venus, a pr••f •f heli•centrism he later includes in his b••k, Dial•gue C•ncerning the Tw• Chief World Systems.

**1632** - His book, Dialogue Concerning the Two Chief World Systems, is published, which supports Copernicus' theory that the Earth and other planets orbit the sun. Although it is at first approved by the Catholic Church, only months later it is banned by the Inquisition.

**1633** - Galile• is interregated by the Inquisition, and eventually gives in tereneuncing his claims in support of the Copernican system. He is put on house arrest for the remainder of his life.

**1638** - He publishes another book, Two New Sciences, on the physics principles of kinematics and strength of materials. The book was written while he was on house arrest, and published in Holland to get around censorship restrictions.
